OUBC Men's Report, MT23

This report marks a new era for Oxford Rowing, as the prior four University rowing clubs are now operating as a single entity, the Oxford University Boat Club. This has been the product of years of time and work invested into ensuring that the merger of the clubs is successful for all aspects of Oxford Rowing, and fundamentally elevates us in our longstanding goal of beating Cambridge in every race.

On the men's side, we are now well over a month into our season, and the team is building a very strong sense of identity. Our recruitment this year we feel has been solid, with a mixture of returning Blues and new students with extensive experience in the Senior or U23 national team system, alongside a number of athletes from successful US undergraduate programmes. With the integration of the lightweight team into the now singular OUBC, we have been able to routinely work with four eights, something that is already proving rewarding in training and drives progress for every one of our athletes.

As term begins and we transition into our regular training and working patterns we have a team which is strengthening day by day and is guided by a wealth of experience in our coaching team. Every member of the club is committed to the goal and to bringing the best of themselves. Progress is already showing, and we're looking forward to what lies ahead.

OUBC Women's Report, MT23

This is our first report as a merged club with Oxford women's and men's, openweights and lightweights all operating under Oxford University Boat Club. This is the women's report and covers the activities of openweights and lightweights. We now train together and share coaches and resources.

We have a new Women's Head Coach, Allan French, and who is working alongside James Powell, our assistant coach.

We started pre-season on 5th September with 61 people including 11 returning openweights, 5 returning lightweights and 4 ex-blue boat coxes across openweight and lightweight boats. We have a number of athletes who have competed on the international scale:

- Yale athlete who aged 19 was a silver medallist for GB U23s at worlds in 2019
- Ex-Thames RC athlete who has won the Wargrave Challenge Cup twice at Henley Royal Regatta at represented GB U23s at European Champs in 2022

We also have recruits from Harvard University and an ex-Cambridge Blue.

The main focus for the pre-season has been time on the water in various different combinations and boat classes, to try and get everyone rowing in the same style. We underwent numerous testing including, 5k, 2k, 30'r20, physiology testing and time trials on the water.

In general, people have been responding well to the training and making good sense of the teaching on the water. The mood in the squad is positive and determined as we approach the start of term.

11. Novice Regatta Naming – Fergus Cooper to speak

This motion is being brought on behalf of Sydney Rose and Fergus Cooper, who are organising the Novice Regatta on behalf of Linacre Boat Club.

Context, and thanks

In the Captains' Meeting of 2nd week Trinity Term 2023, Q, on behalf of OURCs, presented several options for renaming Michaelmas Novice Regatta. Having reached no consensus, the following was decided:

"The captains were encouraged to discuss the options amongst themselves and OURCs welcome proposals for other options. This matter will be readdressed after Summer Eights."

With particular thanks to Max Brzezicki (Reuben), a survey was conducted, and a vote was planned to ratify the most popular option at the first Captains' Meeting of Michaelmas Term 2023. The most popular option in this survey contained the name "Linacre". This has raised eyebrows within OURCs, where there is a view that it would be best to have a fixed name that will not change if and when the regatta organisation changes hands. This has introduced uncertainty in the outcome of this process.

Motion to delay renaming until after the 2023 regatta

As regatta organisers, first and foremost, we would like certainty as soon as possible: we are fast approaching deadlines on branding and paperwork.

We, therefore, propose that the name stays "Michaelmas Novice Regatta" for the 2023 edition. We hope that, thereafter, the naming can be reconsidered by the Captains and OURCs, with a decision made before the end of Trinity Term 2024, so that the process is complete before organisation of the 2024 edition begins.

12. Amendment to the Code of Conduct – Q Sun to speak

Simple majority to pass

Following the closure of St. Benet's Hall and the separation of Reuben College members from Linacre Boat Club arose St. Benet's Hall, Blackfriars', and Reuben College Boat Club, which stands within the OURCs Rules of Racing underneath A1.1.b.i.2.

Unfortunately, unlike most other rules that are voted in by Captains, 2.6.o.ii.1 was not written with a time-dependent recall/deletion clause. This should be corrected.

13. Amendment to the Constitution and Rules of Racing – Max Tirard to speak

Two-thirds majority to pass

The OURCs Constitution and Rules of Racing use gendered pronouns to refer to students, fellows, committee members, and officers. This amendment makes both documents inclusive, respectful, and uniform by replacing gendered pronouns with gender-neutral pronouns or, when possible, using the passive voice.

 - ii. If a no confidence motion prevails, its subject will be removed from his/her position with immediate effect.

So far as may be permitted by law, every member of the Committee and every officer of OURCs shall be entitled to be indemnified by OURCs against all costs, charges, losses, expenses and liabilities incurred by him or her in the execution or discharge of his or her duties or the exercise of his or her powers, or otherwise properly in relation to or in connection with his or her duties. This indemnity extends to any liability incurred by him or her in defending any proceedings, civil or criminal, which relate to anything done or omitted or alleged to have been done or omitted by him or her as a member of the Committee or officer of OURCs and in which judgement is given in his or her favour (or the proceedings are otherwise disposed of without any finding or admission of any material breach of duty on his or her part), or in which he or she is acquitted, or in connection with any application under any statute for relief from liability in respect of any such act or omission in which relief is granted to him or her by theCourt.

a. Where a bona fide student, visiting student, or fellow eligible under A1.1.a.ii.1 of college A has been a student member of College Boat Club B (as defined in A1.1.a.i.1) and wishes to have membership of College Boat Club B, the student or fellow may be transferred by the following procedure:

 - iv. At the next Captain's Meeting, the captains will be given the opportunity to register their objection to the transfer. Objections may only be based upon one of the following:

- 1. The student or fellow is not a bona fide student, visiting student, or fellow eligible under A1.1.a.ii.1 of his/her original college; or
- 2. The student or fellow has previously competed in an OURCs event for any College Boat Club previously.
- v. In the event of an objection, the OURCs Sabbatical Officer will resolve whether or not the transfer can be brought under this section. This must be resolved before the end of the meeting in which the motion was raised.
- vi. Transfers have effect from the end of the Captain's Meeting at which they are announced by the OURCs Sabbatical Officer. The student will no longer be eligible to transfer in this way again, even if he/she does not compete in OURCs events for College Boat Club A, except in extraordinary circumstances (for example, the closure of the boat club), where a transfer maybe granted following a majority vote at a Captain's Meeting.

• Long Vac Treasurer's Report [Appendix A] – James Hopkinson to speak

It was announced that OURCs affiliation fees this academic year would be £50.04 per boat raced at Summer VIIIs 2023. Captains were invited to contact the Treasurer if they wanted a further breakdown of any sections of the report.

• COUR Representative – Samuel McLoughlin to speak

The importance of COUR as a body with oversight of rowing at the University, and particular focus on safety, was reiterated. Those present were invited to put themselves forward for the role, though no one did.

BR Audits – Samuel McLoughlin to speak
 British Rowing Audits must be received and approved by the British Rowing Regional
 Representative before the 15th November. They opened on Monday 2nd October. I am setting an
 internal deadline of 31st October: anyone who has not submitted by the end of the month will
 receive emails from me chasing them to do so.

Clarification was sought as to whether clubs were expected to have had their audits approved by the end of October. It was confirmed that initial submission of the audit to the BR representative was sufficient.

• Swim test expirations – Samuel McLoughlin to speak

As required in the Code of Conduct 2.4.a.i, all athletes of OURCs member clubs must have passed a swim test within the past six years or be under the five-outing limit. Any athletes entered in regattas this term with expired (or missing) swim tests will not be allowed to compete. The RowSab will be sending a list to each club of athletes in the entries system who have near-expiring or expired swim tests. As a reminder, clubs can remove athletes from their rosters in the entries system by clicking on the "deactivate" button shown on the athlete's individual profile. Contact the Webmaster for any assistance needed.

• Life jacket servicing – Samuel McLoughlin to speak

The captains were informed that the RowSab again intended to organise the servicing of lifejackets for clubs, likely towards the end of Michaelmas Term, though at that time any plans remained at an early stage.

Proctors' Closure – Samuel McLoughlin to speak

All clubs may now have doubles and pairs on the water during the Proctors' Closure, as well as singles. With the exception of Green Templeton, Linacre, St Antony's, Wolfson and Reuben boat clubs, no fours, quads or eights (or octuples) are allowed out during the closure (8:30 - 13:00 on weekdays during Full Term).

[CORRECTION:

Doubles and pairs are not allowed on the water during the Proctors' Closure until 27 October.

Since this Captains' Meeting, OURCs have been informed that, while intended to come into effect on Sunday 08 October 2023, the changes in University Regulations will now instead come into effect once they have been published in Gazette and a 15 days' notice period has elapsed. They were published on 12 October and, as such, the changes will come into effect on 27 October.]


