This suggests a potential need to change the documentation required for transfer requests in the future as there is no requirement for evidence beyond permission from both clubs' captains and an enrolment certificate which shows their *current* enrolment, but not past enrolments.

Busy sections of the river, especially around the Gut and bottom of Boathouse Island, should be known by all and constant vigilance therein should be practised.

## 7. Request for Extension of Student Status

Laurentius Heukamp (St Catz) to Speak

Charlie Knight (St. Catherine's) began rowing for St Catz as a Novice in Michaelmas Term 2024 and has now rowed for the Club for 3 terms. During his time, Charlie has shown exceptional dedication to the Club both on and off the water. He now serves on the committee as Secretary and Lower Boats Captain for the 2025 / 2026 academic year and works in the College Hall part time. Charlie has not continued on to do his integrated Master's, despite originally planning to do so. This decision has unexpectedly cut his academic tenure short, which otherwise would have ended in Trinity Term 2026. Charlie remains fully embedded in the life of SCCBC and our rowing community. He is living in Oxford with multiple Catz Men's Seniors and continues to actively contribute to the Club's operations and culture. Given his substantial involvement, leadership roles, his employment at the College Hall and ongoing presence within SCCBC, extending his student status would both recognise his dedication and support his welfare as part of the Catz community.

We would, therefore, like to request an extension of his student status until the end of TT2026 allowing Charlie to compete in bumps competitions as a full member.

#### 8. AOB

Samuel Schipper thanked all in attendance at Autumn Fours for their promptness and the high standard of crews. He asked for feedback from captains on how to cap entries should races continue to be oversubscribed (especially IWL-B on 30 November, which will have an hour less daylight than IWL-A). Captains suggested:

- 1. A cap on the number of crews per club;
- 2. That this cap be in proportion to the size of clubs as described in their early slot applications this term.

Samuel noted that we have more leeway for small boat entries and encouraged competent scullers, doubles, pairs, and fours to enter IWL races.

Sophie Kubik gave some safety reminders:

- 1. As it gets darker, please ensure your lights are **bright** and attached to the bow and stern of the boat. If cycling to the river, or coaching, especially on the towpath, please ensure your bike is equipped with lights.
- 2. Please check equipment before every outing an equipment issue during an outing is dangerous for yourself and other boats on the river.
- **3.** Please, coxes, rowers, and bankriders, stay vigilant on busy stretches of the Isis such as the bottom of Boathouse Island, Longbridges/Greenbanks, and around Falcon Boathouse. The majority of our Incident Reports have occurred in these locations. Coxes especially must be aware of other river traffic and likely congestion points. **Do not assume the river will be empty just because it is early.**
- 4. Falcon is training novices. Please be careful around Falcon Boathouse and any area below the gut.

Julia Bellardo gave an update on the Lion and Chough Regatta, reminding everyone of the coxing briefing that evening and the upcoming entry deadline on Friday. She asked that questions are directed to regatta@sehbc.org.

Sophie Kubik echoed that the Lion and Chough, and Tamesis Regattas, are **not** run by OURCs, and thus questions about entries, coxing, and deadlines for these events should be addressed to the organisers of those regatta@sehbc.org and regatta@linacre.ox.ac.uk), not the Sabbatical Officer or Secretary.
